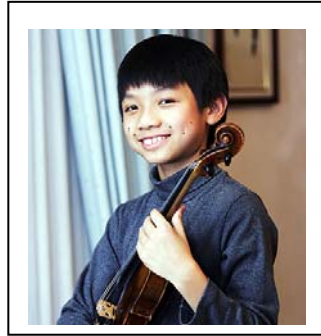

Gabriel Ng



Gabriel Ng is 13 years old and presently studying at The Yehudi Menuhin School in the United Kingdom under the tutelage of Prof. Natasha Boyarsky. He was born in Singapore in 1994 and started learning the violin at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts under Ms Yah Wan Har at the age of four before joining the Yehudi Menuhin School in 2005.

In the 2003 Singapore National Piano and Violin competition, he was awarded the first prize in the Junior Violin category. In May 2007 at the XIV Andrea Postacchini International Violin Competition in Italy, Gabriel was a first prize winner (intermediate category) and was also awarded the Grand Prize.

He has performed as soloist in Singapore, Japan, Edinburgh, London and Wales. In July 2007, he gave his debut concert at the Singapore Esplanade Concert Hall.

Gabriel is a recipient of the Singapore National Arts Council's Gifted Young Musicians' bursary and supported by the Lee Foundation and the Trailblazer Foundation. In 2006, he was awarded the HSBC Youth Excellence Award for Musical Excellence by the President of Singapore.

Julian Dyson



Julian Dyson has worked as a soloist, accompanist and teacher. In London he has performed in all the major venues. Between 1991 and 1994 Julian performed with the Countess of Munster Recital Programme and has been invited to play with many orchestras including the Royal Philharmonic. Engagements abroad as a soloist and chamber musician have taken Julian to a tour of European British Embassies. He has performed all over the world since; in 1994, he combined concerts on land with recitals at sea on Cunard and Princess ships.

In 2000, he was appointed to the staff of the Yehudi Menuhin School where he teaches and accompanies. He is regularly involved in master-classes with musicians such as the late Mstislav Rostropovich and has worked and performed with the violinist Sarah Chang. Recent work as an accompanist has taken him to Addis Ababa and Poland. He has also performed recitals with violinist Akiko Ono in the UK and in Qatar and Dubai following an invitation from the Emir. Recent Solo engagements have included performances of Schumann's Piano Concerto and Rachmaninov's 2nd Piano Concerto.

In July 2007, he performed with Gabriel in his debut Concert at the Singapore Esplanade Concert Hall.
